Harbour among areas needing help, MPs told

Port Hope's harbour is among areas of concern on the Great Lakes that were discussed or Parliament
Hill recently.
Anne Mitchell, executive director of the Canadian Institute tor Environmental Law and Policy, was
heard by several members of Parliament particularly those who sit On the Federal Standing Committee
on the Environment and Sustainable Development that a number of the Great Lakes need to be
cleaned up.
"We depend on that water for our drinking and for our livelihood," she said.
The federal government's lack of support to seriously tackle the problem of cleaning up the Great Lakes
is a "national embarrassment," Ms. Mitchell said.
In 1994, Canada and Ontario signed an agreement to restore degraded areas identified in 17 "Areas of
Concern" in Ontario. Only two have since been restored.

Port Hope's harbour is included in the Areas of Concern that MPs heard about this week.

Ms. Mitchell said she felt the audience genuinely cared about what she said during her two-hour talk.

"I certainly felt that they were listening and that they were concerned. They were all very interested and

concerned and seemed prepared to work with us."

Ms. Mitchell and her group are calling on the federal and provincial governments to immediately restore

funding for the work that had been reduced, hire action plan co-ordinators, regulate the withdrawal of

water from the Great Lakes, require pollution prevention plans for industrial discharges to waste water

treatment plant~, restore monitoring, and convene a gathering of elected politicians, government officials

and stakeholders to revitalize the Great Lakes clean-up effort.

While the MPs who heard Ms. Mitchell suggested new funds may be available through the federal

Ministry of Infrastrllcture for clean-up efforts, they said some initiative would need to come from the

municipalleve! of government in order to obtain them.

Other Areas of Concern on the Great Lakes include Thunder Bay, Nipigon Bay, Peninsula Habour,

Spanish River, Wheatley Harbour. Hamilton Harbour, Metro Toronto Region, Bay of Quintet St. Mary's

River, St. Clair River, Detroit River, Niagara River and the St. Lawrence River.
